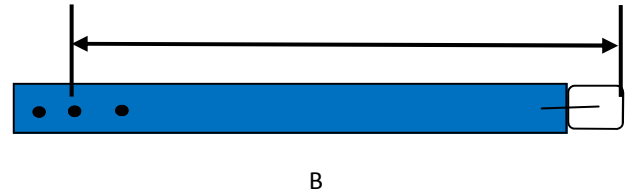
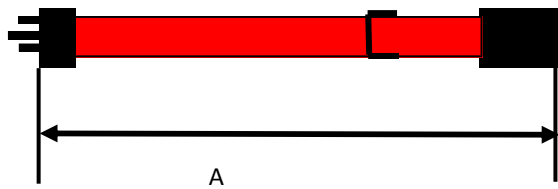


Measuring for the New Collar



If you use a Quick Release Collar –A

1. Fit the collar on your dog the way that you want it. Not too tight (be able to get 3 fingers under the collar), and not too loose (so that it does not slip over your dog's head.)
2. Remove the collar and lay the collar down on a smooth surface and flatten the collar out.
3. Using a tape measure or a yard stick, measure—as shown above. Start just before the “forks” on one end of the collar to where the “forks” snap or disappear in to the black snap buckle. Use the illustration.
4. Write that number down—do not round up or down.
5. Measure 3 times again to make sure that you have a consistent and correct measure.
6. That is the measurement that will be used to make your new collar. Depending upon the type of collar that you select, the collar may have very little to great deal of adjustment.

If you use a Buckle Collar –B:

Follow the above directions but measure between the hole that fits to the outside edge of the buckle. Use Illustration B.

OR

Using a Tape Measure: (Remember to start your measurement on “0” - tape measures usually do not start with “0” at the end of the tape. If you do not pay attention to this detail, the collar will be too large.)

1. Put the tape around the dog's neck and “pretend” that it is a collar. Place the tape where you want the collar to “sit.” Adjust the tape measure so that if you lay 3 fingers flat against your dog's neck, the tape measure is comfortable over your fingers. Not too loose and not too tight. Just like a collar!
2. Holding the tape in place, remove your fingers. Is the tape comfortable for the dog? Can you easily pull it over his ears and off of his head? If so, re-measure-it is too loose.
3. Measure your dog's neck this way 3 times. If you come up with 3 different measurements, keep measuring until you are comfortable with the measurement that you want. Think about whether your dog's neck measurement varies greatly after grooming!

You are totally responsible for the correct measurement of the new collar. If the collar is too small, there is no refund. If it is too large, and can be modified, there is a \$10.00 + postage fee to modify the collar to your new measurements.
